



INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPT: LISA McCLOSKEY
Friday, May 17, 2013

Q. Lisa McCloskey brings new meaning to tackling a course head-on. I make light of a scary situation. First of all, before we talk about your golf, tell us what happened on the way home yesterday.

LISA McCLOSKEY: We had just turned right out of the club and probably had gone maybe like three, four miles and all of a sudden, on the oncoming traffic, like a tow truck of some sort swerved into my lane and I basically caught like the trailer part of it. But like it ended up being that he hit like four other cars, so he just basically came straight into our lane and hit the car to the right of me, and there was another car to the left of me in the turning lane that he hit.

So it was just -- everything happened so fast. Yesterday I was giving the police report and I didn't even really know what to tell them because everything just happened so fast. All I knew is that I kind of slammed on the brakes and kind of veered a little left, but all I felt was kind of the impact.

Q. The seatbelts were on and the air bags went off in your mom's Cadillac. You're fortunate there. Do you feel really fortunate the injuries weren't worse, just some minor injuries?

LISA McCLOSKEY: Yeah, everyone I talked to, I talked to the guy from insurance, the police guys were out there, the ambulance people, everyone was like I can't believe you guys walked away from this because the impact was obviously pretty strong. And then the guy in the car to the right of me, he was taken in the ambulance. I think it was kind of minor stuff, so hopefully he's okay, too.

Q. How were you able to play so well today? I know your wrist has to be hurting quite a bit, it's all taped up.

LISA McCLOSKEY: Well, it's actually my thumb, I kind of cut it right below, right here. You know, I think I came out here with no expectations, just make-the-cut kind of thing. I probably would have been happy with even par or a couple over. But I don't know, the putter was really working for me on the front nine, and then the back nine things kind of slowed down, I think I kind of got a little bit tired. But I finished with two really good pars, so I'm happy.

Q. What are your expectations going into the weekend then?

LISA McCLOSKEY: You know, I'm just happy to be able to play today and tomorrow and the day after, so I'll just kind of take it as it comes and hopefully put two more good rounds out there.
