

**ROUND 2 INTERVIEW: DAN FORSMAN & MIKE REID**  
**Saturday, April 25, 2015**



**Q. Dan, maybe just talk about your day. You guys are right now 2-back going into tomorrow.**

**DAN FORSMAN:** Yeah, we had a good day. We didn't have any bogeys, which on a day like today is a good accomplishment. Mike played really well, hit some great shots. I tried to contribute as well, and I think we ham and egged it pretty well today. I think that was our story. It was a tough day for scoring and 5-under is a good score.

**Q. Obviously the wind is a huge factor out here, how much on club selection today?**

**DAN FORSMAN:** It's huge. You've got the wind gusting from different directions at times so it was really tricky. Mike hit a couple iron shots that we thought were going to be perfect and they sailed in the wind and they go just long. So it was just a very tricky day to select the right club. You had to commit to your shot and even then you had to be lucky.

**Q. Going back to Top of the Rock tomorrow. Right now you're right there, like I said, a couple shots back.**

**DAN FORSMAN:** Yeah, that's all you could hope for really. We want to be right in the middle of it and hopefully tomorrow, if we get a break with the wind, maybe we can go out there and just keep playing well and ham and egg like we've doing and hopefully make some putts, have a chance.

**Q. Mike, I just asked Dan how things went for you today. Windy day?**

**MIKE REID:** Yeah, it was tough pulling the right club, and like Dan said, even harder once you get the club in your hand to commit to playing the shot. It can make you look bad at times. We were joking on the 17th hole about the occasion where you're going to look pretty bad sometimes and other times you look like a hero and you didn't hit the shot that much different.

**Q. Any particular holes out here that were really treacherous during the day? It was probably blowing pretty well most of the time?**

**MIKE REID:** Some of the par 3s played -- No. 7, that downhill par 3 was playing 220-something, 225, and into a little bit of a crosswind. And then No. 9 was right in the teeth of the wind a little over 200 yards and it was a full 3-wood for me just to get to pin high. Those holes sort of stand out. They almost play like par 4s, you try to make birdie.

**Q. You've got to be happy where you stand right now?**

**MIKE REID:** Yeah, we're thrilled. I think we're in position to -- you never know what will happen tomorrow but you give it a go. Looking forward to just -- it's great to be in a team format, I think. I'm just honored that Dan would have me as a partner.
