

FINAL ROUND INTERVIEW: KENNY PERRY
Sunday, May 17, 2015



Q. You made a little run there; made them think about you anyway, I think.

KENNY PERRY: Well, I got going there. I made a terrible bogey, two bogeys back to back on like 4 and 5, and then I birdied 7, 8 and 9, and kind of -- then I had a chance for eagle on 11 and made birdie there. So yeah, I kind of got it running, but that's the way I played all week. I was always feast or famine. I'd either make a bunch of birdies or I made some killer bogeys that really stopped the momentum. But I shot one better than last year and I won at 8-under last year and now I shoot 9 and it's way behind, but it was a good week. It's a top 10. I played nicely for basically not having everything together. I played okay in spurts, and then in spurts I played -- my swing left me and I drove it very poorly and then I drove it really well. Normally when I drive it good, I drive it good all week, I don't get off, and I was really off on the second round. I don't think I hit about two or three fairways all day and struggled and shot 69. Actually shot better than the days I hit the driver good. I don't know, this week's been a crazy week. But thank goodness the weather stayed away from us. I hate leaving here, this is one of my favorite courses. I haven't played the course we're going to play next year, so I don't know nothing about it so we'll just have to come in there next year and see what it's all about.

Q. There is some -- you have a sentimental feeling about a course that you've won at?

KENNY PERRY: Oh, yeah, definitely, definitely. When you win at a place, you get good vibes, good memories and you hate to just leave them. I hope we come back again one day. I know for three years we won't. Hopefully, I think once the ladies are going to have the U.S. Open here in '18 I think, I think that's what kicked us out, which I can understand. I can't hog the course all the time. I was lucky to enjoy it four or five years and it was a lot of fun. The membership here is great, the golf course is fantastic, I love the south, so always feel very comfortable in the south.

Q. Did that little splattering of rain we got last night affect the course in any way?

KENNY PERRY: Well, the greens really changed on the weekend. The ball was spinning a lot, backing up a lot, it was harder to hold your wedges. First two days the greens were firm and fast, the golf course was really playing fast and hard. Then it changed. We had enough rain at night, it really changed the golf course. It made it really soft where you had to kind of really pay attention on your wedge shots. I put a lot of spin on the ball and I was having trouble, my ball was spinning all over the place and I couldn't really keep it around the holes.
