

**ROUND 2 INTERVIEW: BART BRYANT**  
**June 25, 2016**

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**Q. Are you right where you want to be?**

**BART BRYANT:** Absolutely. I think within one or two of the lead for sure, so you can't ask for more than that. Any time you have an opportunity to go out and shoot a round the last day and have a chance to pull out a victory, can't ask for any more than that.

**Q. What was the key for you today?**

**BART BRYANT:** Putting. Yeah, I actually did not drive the ball great today, which is usually my strong point. But I made a boatload of putts, and I think whenever you have a great tournament you look back, that's usually what the catalyst is, you know. I think good putts. I made a huge putt on No. 8, probably a 40 or 50-footer, then I made another 20-footer there on the last hole and a couple other 15-footers, so made more than my share of putts today.

**Q. Is the movement of guys this week any different than what you see in any other week in terms of what we can anticipate for tomorrow and the fact that there's so many guys still in the mix?**

**BART BRYANT:** Oh, yeah, yeah, a lot of weeks it's like this, a lot of guys in the mix. But this tournament you're going to have to go low obviously. I mean, scores are extremely low here. And we see that a few times a year where you've got to go out the last day, even though you've shot two low rounds you've got to shoot a third low round. This is one of those venues where you're go to have to do that.

**Q. What's your mindset going into tomorrow, what do you think about?**

**BART BRYANT:** You just try to do what you've done the two previous days and for me it's getting the ball in the fairway, giving myself opportunities, and if the putter works well then usually I'm okay. The mindset will be to stay fairly aggressive because you know you're going to have to go out and shoot a low round to come out on top.

**Q. Did the wind today make it trickier than yesterday?**

**BART BRYANT:** Oh, no doubt, no doubt. Although scores are pretty good today, but the wind made it a little more difficult. And right off the bat today on the first hole I hit a 3-wood off the tee and hit a 7-iron in. Normally you're going to have a pitching wedge, plug it to the bunker and bogey the first hole. That's not typically what would happen on the course because you don't have that kind of wind in your face so it did affect you. Luckily I was able to recover today, but it was a lot tougher. If you got a little sideways out there, it was a tough course, you know. If you're hitting it straight it's an easy course.
