

Q. Well, you had a front row seat to the guy who came from behind to win, you knew somebody would. Did you think it was Kirk and when did you get that feeling?

BILLY ANDRADE: Well, you don't know who it's going to be. Obviously he played a flawless round of golf, just made that one bogey on 10, had that great run of four in a row on the back, but he didn't really get himself in any trouble and just kind of was -- it was pretty nonchalant actually, just seemed to not get in his own way and he played great golf and hats off to him. He finished it off today, shoot 65? Is that what his final round was? That usually gets the job done.

Q. Sure. What kept you maybe or especially early on in the round from making that big move?

BILLY ANDRADE: You know, I had an eagle putt on 2 that I just missed from about 10 feet. I birdied 3, I was a couple under. The next few holes I didn't birdie and then I hit a bad wedge on 6. I made my first bogey of the day on the 6th hole and then I bogeyed 9, the other par 5, and I was going for the green in two and hit a terrible 3-wood, kind of actually chunked it and then hit a wedge over the green, didn't get it up and down. So those two sixes really cost me. Going to the back, what can you do, you're playing with a guy who is four ahead of you and he's making birdies. I shot 32 on the back, which was a nice comeback and it was a nice week, but, you know, I want to win. I want to be Kirk Triplett this week and unfortunately I wasn't, so --

Q. You hadn't made a bogey in the tournament?

BILLY ANDRADE: I hadn't, no. That was the first two bogeys I made -- only two bogeys I made all week. It was a nice week, this is a great place, Steve Stricker is awesome to have this tournament with American Family Insurance. You know, we need to come to places like this. This is what our Champions Tour is all about, to see great people come out and follow us that remember us from way back when in places like Madison that embrace us. And so hats off to Steve and his family and for American Insurance to have us because this course and this tournament is just going to get better and better as we go.

Q. You posted pretty consistent scores all week. How hard is it to do what Kirk did and go low that one day?

BILLY ANDRADE: Well, you know, it happens. Someone's going to do it and great for him. He just said to me that he was complaining to his wife that he hasn't played very good this year and so to have a round like this and have a tournament like this is what we're all striving to do. So great for him and he's a great player, he's won a lot of tournaments out here.
