



GAVIN GREEN (E)

Q. Maybe tell us about your round today?

GAVIN GREEN: Oh, man, it was a huge struggle today. I hit it decent, but a couple of bad shots kind of led me to a triple. Just couldn't get anything going. I hit it -- we had a couple of close ones but just didn't make any putts also and that kind of messed up the momentum a little bit after a good start. It is what it is, you know? Just learn from it and come back the next week and be comfortable.

Q. Maybe just walk us through that triple bogey?

GAVIN GREEN: It was bad swing. And I hit a good shot coming out but it was in a horrible lie again in the rough. Just couldn't get it out of rough, it's just so thick around here. I was in very bad shape in the rough, just couldn't control it out of the rough and didn't get up and down and made 7. It was a huge momentum killer for me. I tried to get back on the train, I tried to get back and gave myself looks, but it's just tough after a triple, you know? But I gave it my best shot so can't really complain.

Q. (Inaudible) so now you're going to play the WGC China?

GAVIN GREEN: Hopefully, I think so. I think there's not many people overtaking me this week, I'll be okay. As long as I remain in the top 4, so we'll see. Hopefully, I'll still remain.

Q. So I like to know, what is your schedule like after these tournaments?

GAVIN GREEN: I'm playing in Korea next week and then hopefully WGC if I stay in top 4. Jazz is playing well, I don't know how the others are doing, so we'll see.

Q. So you don't know your schedule for the next --

GAVIN GREEN: Next month I think I'll be focusing on Asian Tour, trying to just secure my number -- secure the OM. But after this week I think it's going to be really bunched up up there, so I'm going to have to have a good two, three months coming in.

Q. So you can play in more tournaments?

GAVIN GREEN: I will see but I think I'm going to have to -- I'm going to have to see what events are big on Asian Tour and I'm going to have to do well in those. Hopefully get a couple of high finishes towards the end of the year and hopefully that's enough. There's so many good players. Like I said, Jazz is playing well, a couple of Thai guys are playing well,

so it's going to be a close one.

Q. All in all, Gavin, how would you sum up your week at the CIMB Classic against the world's best players?

GAVIN GREEN: I mean, I played last year, but going through the Asian Tour, I'm not happy with myself, not at all. Pretty disappointed just because it's -- it's my home course, home crowd, but I just couldn't get anything going this week. It was quite frustrating for me. But on the bright side, I've got the next two weeks to look at and hopefully do well those next two weeks.

Q. You're going to play in a big one in the World Golf Championship in Shanghai and against all the big boys again. Any goals you set for your set for yourself?

GAVIN GREEN: I think I'll work a little bit more on my short game. You know, I struggled with it this week. But other than that, I think it's fine. I think a lot of positives obviously, but there's a lot of things I can improve on also.
