Q. Congratulations. You came in at 132 and now you're at 124, you're headed to New Jersey. Big smile on your face. How does it feel?

Q. Does the pressure mount? I mean, you missed a short one at 10 and 11, you go bogey-bogey, and for the moment you had fallen out of the top 125. Did you know that?

HARRIS ENGLISH: I didn't know that. I didn't really look a whole lot this week on what I had to finish. I knew that I had to give it my best and go play well and really try to go out and win the tournament because winning, if I go win the tournament, it's going to take care of itself. Really coming in with the mindset I wanted to chase Brandt and CT this morning and get out there and make some birdies, which I did on the front nine, but it was pretty pressure packed on the back nine. There's some tough pins. If you start hitting the rough, you've got some tough two-putts, which I had. The two-putt at the last will be in my memory for a long time.
