
Q. Brandt, what a day, and I think maybe we had an idea the beginning of the week, you shot 59 and made some history, that you really had the inside track to this tournament. It got interesting, but in the end you made those great shots when you needed to today.

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yeah, I'm so proud of the way I hung in there today. I knew it wasn't going to be easy, I knew somebody was going to come and put a charge on me. Played a great front nine, played a great back nine, too. Made one mistake, I had a three-putt on 13. But besides that, played pretty much a flawless round of golf. To do that under the pressure I've had all week, being in the lead, shoot a 59, have all the expectations in the world on me this week put on myself, to be honest with you, it's really great to rise to the occasion.

Q. So you know Pan is trying to catch you on the back nine and does at a certain point?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yes.

Q. I thought that third shot that you hit at the 15th, that was an awful lie but you were able to hit that about three feet away and get your birdie at 15.

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yeah, that's what won me the tournament. That's the shot of the tournament for me, not the 59. To be able to hit that shot under that pressure knowing I had to get that shot up and down. I knew C.T. was at 20. It was a horrible lie. Really not a lot of good could come out of that shot and I pulled it off and hit a great shot.

When I look back on this week, I'll think of two things: I'll think about the 59 on Thursday and I'll think of that chip shot I hit to three feet and made birdie.

Q. When we looked at your bag, the bright yellow Bridgestone bag, it says "Sned's" on it, but it also says "Wyndham Rewards." You have made so many great friends within that company and here at Sedgefield Country Club. What does it mean for you to win it a second time, but for the first time here at Sedgefield Country Club?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: It means the world to me. Those people treated me like family. Steve Holmes and Geoff Ballotti and Mike Brown, the guys at Wyndham, have really treated me like one of their sons or one of their kids. To do this for them means the world to me, and to do it here in Greensboro where I got my first one, kind of everything comes full circle. It's such a cool feeling, I can't put into words. It feels so right in so many different ways and

that's probably why I put even more pressure on myself the last two days, because I knew what it would mean to everybody else who's put so much time, energy and effort into my career. So to be able to give them this, to be able to share this with them is so special.
