



ADAM HADWIN (-14)

Q. Adam, still in the mix, just one back. It's a cramped leaderboard. Just thoughts on your round today.

ADAM HADWIN: Yeah, it was to be expected. Not one of us there in the final group kind of built any sort of separation. We couldn't get anything going as a group. Some good shots, missed putts. I think Bryson and I kind of struggled a little bit more there getting into the greens. But only one back with 18 holes to go, so we have a chance to win a golf tournament.

Q. You guys were probably starting when Matt Wolff was going wild making the turn. What did you think when you saw that leaderboard when you started?

ADAM HADWIN: Yeah. I mean, obviously you look up and you see someone's playing really well. You knew scores were going to be like that, you knew guys that started 6, 7, 8, 9 under even, one of them or a few of them were going to post 64s or lower. You know, you just had to keep trying to fire for pins, keep trying to hit good shots and I kind of scrambled my way to a couple under today.

Q. Is that the mentality you have to take into tomorrow, keep firing at pins, the scores are going to be low?

ADAM HADWIN: Yeah, absolutely. I don't imagine this golf course changing much overnight. You're going to have to continue to be aggressive. Hopefully, you know, roll a few putts in tomorrow.

Q. Do you kind of have a target in mind, you know, when you go to bed tonight and think that's what I need to reach, or do you --

ADAM HADWIN: No, I don't really have a target. If I had to guess, I'd say I've probably got a minimum tomorrow, probably 5, 6 under to have a chance. Again, you've probably got guys in the 10, 11 under that are 5, 6, 7 under pretty easily. Just go out and try and play some good golf and hopefully bring a little bit better rhythm than I did today.

Q. Do you guys kind of feed off each other when nobody in the group could kind of get it going?

ADAM HADWIN: Yeah. You know, sometimes that can work against a group a little bit. You know, Scott hit it well there for quite a good stretch and just couldn't see the ball go in. Yeah, it was a bit of a -- you know, I said to him in the scoring trailer, we kind of played a bit

like duds today in that final group, at least it seemed like it with everybody else playing so well. But we're right there. I mean, like I said, I scrambled around, got a couple under and got a chance to win tomorrow.

Q. We have two guys atop the leaderboard basically just out of college. Does that surprise you, kids these days?

ADAM HADWIN: Not really, not anymore. You've been seeing it for so many years now. The last four, five, six years, guys just come straight out of college and have no fear and play well on the PGA TOUR. Certainly no surprise that they're up there and, you know, I'm going to go try and chase them down tomorrow.
