



**LUCAS GLOVER (-16)**

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**Q. Best round of the year in 2019, Lucas Glover. You make over 150 feet of putts. You started the day eight shots out of the lead. Did you come here with an attitude of aggression on Sunday?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** No, not really. I came with the same attitude I've had. I just, I read them half a ball better all day today. I was on the hole a lot the first three rounds and I hit it the same as I did round 1 and 3, I just made those 12 to 18 and a couple of longer putts. You know, shame I misread the last one, but it was a good stroke. I didn't see that much. But never complain about making putts no matter what you shoot, so pretty good day.

**Q. Give us a sense of how the course is playing today.**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** It's good, it's a good Sunday setup. Got some good pins, accessible if you're in the right spot, accessible if you're in the fairways. Eighteen will be pretty dramatic later on. Backstop back there if you have to lay up, and going for it, you know, you're chipping, pitching for long and easy. Yeah, it will be exciting coming down the stretch for the guys.

**Q. It was a great round, and considering where you are right now, do you have any sense of optimism that maybe you could be in the mix later on in the afternoon?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** No, no, none whatsoever. I needed a few more and I didn't have enough holes. You know, you never know in this silly game, but there's too many guys, and then everybody can play, obviously. A lot of birdie holes and the greens and the conditions are so perfect that I think I'll watch the finish on the couch.

**Q. Lucas, you ended yesterday four out of five birdies and picked it up right where you left off, didn't you?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah, I did. Knocked in a somewhat lengthy one on the first hole and kind of got going. I had to lay up on two and still made par and then just kind of caught fire after that. Putter was hot, just read them better, frankly. I was on the hole a lot the first three rounds, just didn't make much. And then today late in the round I picked up a little something in my routine and my speed all of a sudden got better and it was still there today, so couldn't be happier.

**Q. How good does that feel? I mean, you've been out here a long time.**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah.

**Q. When the putter starts clicking, man, I saw it, you had a little pep in your step.**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah, for sure. When you're putting well and you're seeing some go in, you don't have to go at all the flags, especially on a Sunday. You feel good about making some 15- and 18-footers and that was the case today. I didn't hit it all that close. I played the par 5s well and I just made a ton of those 12- to 20-footers and that was the tale of the game for me today.

**Q. You're 39th in FedExCup points, obviously you're going to move higher after this performance. You've had a really good year.**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah, I've had a nice year, I've had a nice year. Struggled of late, a few missed cuts in a row, but coming here, I liked the course when I saw it Tuesday and then just had to learn it a little bit. But it's a great golf course and, you know, a little springboard for next week and hopefully for The Open Championship, so very happy.

**Q. And lastly, the guys this afternoon, there's some birdies out there, aren't there?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah, yeah, yeah. I mean, it's a good Sunday setup, it's a solid Sunday setup. It's not easy, but there's just so many birdie holes, there's so many wedges, and the greens and the conditions are so good that there's going to be a lot of birdies, for sure.

**Q. So you sit back and just watch on television, relax this afternoon?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah. I'm staying about half a mile away, so the couch is calling my name, do a little laundry, and then head down to Moline.

**Q. We've seen some low rounds already this week, we knew there was the possibility of another one being out there this morning and picked up Lucas on the back nine, you were already hot at that stage. When did you know that something special was up?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** I don't know, I hadn't thought about it yet. You know, the turn. I made an eight-and-a-half footer on nine for par and sometimes those feel like birdies when you're trying to keep momentum. So turning there, it was one of those, all right, we're reading them good, we're hitting our line, let's just give ourselves as many looks as possible, and we did that. We read them great until 18.

**Q. You've always given yourself plenty of looks, putter hasn't always been your best friend, but you talk about seeing the lines, getting them started. The putter certainly warmed up there. Coming down the stretch, did you have a clear read on those at 17 and 18?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Seventeen, I did, I didn't quite get it there, and then 18, I hit my spot.

When I looked up, my little line I put on it was rolling in, there just wasn't enough break. I've been over-reading them all week and that one just broke more than I saw.

Patton and I were laughing, even after seeing his chip down the hill, I still didn't believe that it could move that much, but sure enough it did. I can't complain about the stroke, I just didn't see that much and I didn't play enough break. But, you know, I hit my lines pretty much all day and read them pretty close, so I'm pretty happy.

**Q. Now, okay, you put yourself right in the mix here. The leaders are still getting ready to go on the golf course. What do you do this next little while?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Pack my locker up and go sit on the couch. The golf course is too perfect, conditions are too good, and the guys, like we say every week, 1 to 156 can win. There's just too many birdie holes and everybody can play, and they're playing well or they wouldn't be teeing off now instead of when I did.

**Q. Thoughts on the round? We had you on 59 watch there for a little bit.**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah, thank you. Yeah, it was good. I didn't play all that much different than the first three days, I just made a bunch of putts, made a lot of those 10- to 20-footers and just confidence kept growing and my reads were solid. Shame I misread the last one, but I did. That's golf and life and all those clichés, but never disappointed with a round like that, especially on a Sunday.

**Q. Patton said you guys had a lot of fun out there. It was almost like match play on the front, you guys were trading back and forth there?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah, we drug each other along, for sure. It never hurts when you're doing that in my position or his position to drag each other along. Yeah, we hit it about the same and we were on each other's line a lot putting, so it was a fun day. I've known Patton for years and we get along well and we had a nice time.

**Q. What did you have there on 18?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah, no, I don't know, nine, 10 feet, 11 feet down the hill right to left. I kind of over-read most of my putts all week and just didn't give it enough. It was a good stroke, I flushed it and my ball was rolling end over end, there just wasn't break. Couldn't hit it that hard because of the downhill and down grain and that stuff. I didn't get it out there high enough, I didn't see enough. That's on me. But I made a good stroke, that's all you can do.

**Q. Overall impressions of the course, the tournament, the Twin Cities?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Everything's great, we had a ball. Weather was good. We had that one little hiccup on Thursday weather-wise, but no, what a great week and great course. It's fun,

area's great, people were excited to see us, which is always nice. Yeah, I had a ball here.

**Q. You'll be back for the next six years?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Oh, absolutely. Six years? I'll be real old by then.

**Q. I was just going to ask, you had a nice mix, you stuck it close and you had some nice long putts on the birdies.**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Yeah, I stuffed a couple but not all that many. It was just I made a lot -- I don't know the footage, I'm not good at that, but 10 to 20 feet I was -- I don't know, somebody said I made over 150 feet of putts today. I guess that's pretty good. That's probably more than I made all week, to be honest, but I kind of felt it coming. I don't know if it would be this week or November, but I hit the hole a lot the first three days and it was one of those, don't get down about it because you're stroking it nice, just got to read them a little better. And I might have read 10 putts half a ball better than I did yesterday. That's the difference. It's a silly game, as we all know, but truthfully, that was all it was. My caddie, Coop, and I, we just read them a fraction better today.

**Q. How do you characterize your season?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** Solid, solid. Not great. Obviously in pretty good position heading up to the FedExCup and a little momentum for next week. Hopefully going into The Open I've got to keep some momentum, but, you know, solid. Nothing -- that's all I can really -- that's exactly how I can characterize it.

**Q. Have you spent much time up here through the years?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** I've been to Hazeltine a few times for two college events and the PGA, so that was '09 and '97 and '98 for the Preview and then the -- sorry, '98 and '99. Luke Donald won. But other than that, no. Those were the three times I've been here.

But always had good luck. The head pro at Hazeltine reminded me of that on Friday over on the 10th tee. He said, "Man, you've always had pretty good luck around this area." Thanks, buddy. Appreciate it. Always good to here.

**Q. Four days in a row someone shot a 62. Is there something lower out there do you think?**

**LUCAS GLOVER:** I don't know. Probably, I don't know. I think now that everybody knows the course, you know, there will be some more -- a little more, I don't know, less free play this afternoon. There's still going to be a bunch of birdies, 20 under's still going to win in my opinion, but I think next year you might see a little more now that we know the course a little better and know the greens and stuff like that.
