

DYLAN FRITTELLI (-9)

Q. Dylan, what a great round of golf, you find nine birdies out there.

DYLAN FRITTELLI: Yeah, it was good. I managed to make a few putts today, which was a difference. It was a lot easier this morning, the greens are nice and flat, but yesterday it was pretty tricky, but proud of the round.

Q. A few putts may be an understatement. You had 117 feet in putts, really good.

DYLAN FRITTELLI: Might be my career low. I don't know if I made that many or that much distance before. No, it was really good out there, I had a great time. Marc Leishman played well as well and had a good round.

Q. Hiccup on the end with a bogey on your last hole, a par 5. That's not something you carry with you, though?

DYLAN FRITTELLI: No, not at all. I laid up perfectly on the fairway and ended up being in a hole, had a tough lie to even get it on the green. Managed to hit a good wedge shot that rolled just through and then tricky shot again from a tough lie and just missed a four-, five-footer, but not too upset.

Q. I remember I talked to you earlier in the week at Silvis, at the John Deere, and you were talking about confidence. After you won there it seemed like you were -- just your body language on the golf course had greatly improved. Has that carried on and how's that win affected you?

It gave me a ton of confidence and obviously a bit of clarity knowing that you don't have to maybe make a good effort here this week and keep your card and do all those crazy things that your mind tends to go to. So came here really relaxed, played well last week and managed to finally play through and get in contention on the weekend besides that win in Illinois.

Q. Presidents Cup on your mind at all?

DYLAN FRITTELLI: No, not at all. I think that's far away. If I win one of these and the next two or three, then maybe have my name in the hat, but I'll definitely be gunning for it, hopefully make a tough decision for Ernie.
