

**GARY WOODLAND (-12)**

**Q. What is it about Asia, four straight top-5s for you here in Asia?**

**GARY WOODLAND:** Yeah, I don't know if I'm coming off a break. Usually when I come over here I'm fresh, you know, and I like coming over. I think it's a lot of distractions away. You know, we're staying in a hotel, we're all hanging out together, it's more about golf. There's really nothing else going on. Hanging out with the guys, I think that's pretty relaxing for me. I've had a lot of success, to be honest with you, with Malaysia and then Korea the last couple years, and now playing great in Japan this week. I like coming over here. The fans are hungry for the game. This week was unbelievable and just glad to play well.

**Q. I know it was critical last year, your best year on the FedExCup, you started so well here. How important is that to get off to a good start again this year?**

**GARY WOODLAND:** It's huge because there's so many tournaments now before Maui, that didn't used to be the case. So if you don't get off to a good start, you're behind the eight ball and you're kind of pressing. So it's nice to get off to a good start, play solid and give yourself some momentum going into the start of the year. We're finishing earlier so we have to get off an earlier start.

**Q. I know you wanted to impress before Tiger picks his P Cup. How happy are you with the way the last two weeks have gone in that regard?**

**GARY WOODLAND:** Yeah, very happy. I had a great start to the year last year and I kind of had a lull there after the U.S. Open, which was frustrating. But five weeks off, came back to Vegas and found some things in Vegas and it's turned in some pretty good weeks the last couple weeks.

**Q. Did you and Tiger talk about at all captain's picks, Presidents Cup at all?**

**GARY WOODLAND:** We talked about it. We joked with each other that we both needed a pick so we're out here trying to impress Tiger. But I think Tiger's got a good grasp on what he wants to do. Fortunately, I got off -- like I said, I had a great year earlier in the year and I played well the last two weeks, so hopefully that's enough. I'm kind of in lala land from the standpoint where if you don't make the team, you never know what happens, but I feel pretty good about my chances and I'm happy with where my game's at.

**Q. For years we've always kind of fixated on the 18 number, majors, when it comes to defining his career. Eighty-two seems like it's almost a little bit more special. Would you agree with that?**

**GARY WOODLAND:** I think it's turning into that because I think it's a lot harder to win week in and week out out here. Obviously the majors speak for themselves, but a lot of guys, 82's just a crazy number. You look at the guys that have won 10 times and it's pretty special, let alone to come out here and win 82 times. To battle through the injuries he's dealt with, gosh, he's young and he's playing unbelievable. The ball-striking exhibition I've seen the last two days is a joke. So I don't see him stopping anytime soon. Eighty-two's pretty special. I think there's a lot more in store.
