

HARRIS ENGLISH (-11)

Q. Harris, it was kind of a ho-hum round and then you roll in that long birdie at 15 and everything sort of changed. What was the momentum like coming down the stretch?

HARRIS ENGLISH: Yeah, sometimes it just takes a putt to go in. I made -- I hit a nice drive on 15, hit a nice 9-iron up there about 30 feet short. I thought I hit it closer than that. then one of the best putts of the day went in. And then they moved the tee up on 16, made it drivable. Hit a driver just short of the green, chip and a putt, tap-in there. Then really good 7-iron at 17 and kind of had the momentum going into 18. Kind of in between clubs coming into 18, hit it over the green and then made a nice putt for birdie.

Q. Kind of wish that you didn't have to stop playing?

HARRIS ENGLISH: Yeah.

Q. Play another nine?

HARRIS ENGLISH: Yeah, it kind of happened yesterday, too. I think I shot 5 under on the back nine. So it's something about the back nine that fits my eye a little bit better than the front. Hopefully tomorrow I can come out of the gate a little faster and beat up the front nine, because I know it's going to take a good bit of birdies to get it done tomorrow.

Q. Overall, last two outings have been pretty decent results. What's been going so consistent with your game the last two-and-a-half rounds?

HARRIS ENGLISH: Really just hitting the ball well, especially out here, a lot of greens in regulation the past couple days. sounds simple, but if you're putting for birdie, a lot of the time it's going to be a pretty good round.

Played well at Muirfield last week. It's a total different test than this one, a lot of yellow lights and red lights at Muirfield. A lot of green lights out here, foot on the pedal and try to make as many birdies as you can. Try to get in that mindset, good finish today and hopefully can keep it rolling for tomorrow's round.

Q. With Denny also posting 11 under, kind of happy you don't have to worry about playing by yourself tomorrow?

HARRIS ENGLISH: We were actually talking about that coming down 18, I knew if I made birdie I'd probably be paired with him. It's a plus. I played by myself on the weekend at Muirfield last week end. It's tough, it's tough to maintain the rhythm. It's nice sometimes to

feed off your partner you're playing with and to keep the same pace, so I'm happy to play with Denny. I'm good buddies with him and hopefully we can get something rolling tomorrow.

Q. What has the Tour told you about the future of that special type of grouping?

HARRIS ENGLISH: Yeah, it's a good brotherhood we've had the past couple weeks. I think they're meeting again on Monday to discuss about all the positive guys, because really Nick Watney's the only one who's tested negative and he was the first one to get it. So I guess we're close to testing negative, but you just don't really know. Hopefully they'll change a rule to where we can feel normal out here and go in the clubhouse and see the physio, see the trainer and then feel like we're part of the group again.

Q. You'll have separation anxiety from the other two guys if you have that?

HARRIS ENGLISH: It's been fun hanging out with guys, we've made the most of it and that's what you've got to do. Weird times right now and we're kind of in a weird situation, but we've done the best we could.
