

JIM FURYK (-6)

Q. Jim, I always thought this would be a good course for you, tight fairways, and you dominated again today, you only missed two fairways in this round to fashion 6 under par.

JIM FURYK: Yeah, I do like the golf course. I probably should have played this one a little more often in my career. I came here last year for the first time and enjoyed the course. Last year was a little different, it was a little firmer, a little more baked out, tougher to hit fairways, tougher to hit greens, and last year from kind of morning to afternoon there was big swings in scoring just from it had moisture on it in the morning but the dry, hot air here would get it baked out in the afternoon. Now with kind of the cloud cover and such, it's holding that moisture in the afternoon, still able to shoot some good numbers.

Q. Of course your win at the Ally, you're trying to become a golfer who wins on both PGA TOUR Champions and on the big tour in the same season or at least the same calendar year. How is the adjustment going back and forth?

JIM FURYK: I've only played one event so far on the Champions Tour, so there really hasn't been a big adjustment. And when I did go play, it was on a golf course that I knew very well, that I won a PGA TOUR event on. I'll tell you in about two months. I'm planning on playing out there a bunch here in the next couple of months.

I think the three rounds is the significant difference. It's a little bit of a track meet. You go out there and you shoot even par or over par for nine holes and you feel like you really don't have as much time for recovery.

You know, the golf courses are obviously -- they're not short, they're about 7,000 yards out there, but shorter than what we're used to seeing on the PGA TOUR. As I like to say, I'm hoping, I'm hoping I can get used to hitting some more short irons because my long irons are getting a little worn out and sore out here.
