HUDSON SWAFFORD (-18)



Q. Hudson, going through that back nine, you're fighting some adversity, things aren't quite going your way and you step up to 17 and you hit one of the best shots I've seen under pressure right there. Take us through that sequence.

HUDSON SWAFFORD: It was kind of like the shot on 17 at PGA West when I won. I just told myself -- I actually hit two good shots on 16 and really didn't hit a great putt and I was kind of bummed out. I was like, man, you've got to step up and just hit a good flighted 6-iron. I've done it a hundred thousand times, love hitting that golf shot. Man, it was a good one and an even better putt.

Q. Sure was. Stepping up here at 18, trying to get your second win, what's going through your mind there over that putt?

HUDSON SWAFFORD: I just hit it solid. I've been putting beautifully all week, hitting a lot of good putts. Obviously a couple on the back nine that just burned the edges, but I putted great on the front, putted great all week. Kyle just said hit one last solid putt and you never know. The first putt I thought I hit pretty hard, but it started bouncing kind of like some of my chips on the back nine and didn't stop. It was a solid putt and went right in.

Q. And coming back from injury, getting your second win on the PGA TOUR, tell us what that means to you.

HUDSON SWAFFORD: Man, it's amazing. Words can't really describe it. Last two years have been tough. Not family-wise, though. Me and my wife had our first son, life's great and golf was really hard, and to do this, it's fun. This is why I get up and grind.
