Q. Congratulations on winning the Birdies Fore Love competition. Just talk about winning \$300,000.

COREY CONNERS: It's pretty amazing. I saw my name on the leaderboard at the start of the week and I was trying to make as many birdies as I could and, you know, try and get myself up to the top. Pretty humbled to have gotten it done.
