



**KEVIN KISNER ( -12)**

**Q. Kev, bogey-free 66, pretty special day for you out there. I thought maybe you could have gone lower. What do you think?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** Yeah, I did. The last two days I felt like I've missed a few opportunities on the greens, hit really nice putts that haven't gone in, so going to have to take a low one tomorrow. Hopefully, they'll all go in tomorrow.

**Q. Nobody's ever won two of these RSM Classics. You have an opportunity and of course Robert Streb does, too. What's it going to take tomorrow? You say you have to go low. Will you be more aggressive?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** No, you can't get too aggressive over here because you've got to give yourself a lot of chances on the greens. The greens are so pure, you can knock the putts in. Just don't need him to get too far away and see if I can't put some heat on him early tomorrow.

**Q. I was with you when you won here and I interviewed you afterwards, how special it was. You grew up close to here, so it would be kind of cool. I guess not that many people are -- it's still special, right?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** Yeah. I have my family down here with me, so it would be cool to get one with them around. Obviously Sea Island Resort's a special place to me, been a member here for a number of years and we come down here for vacation all the time, so it's a cool place and it would be great to be a champion again.

**Q. Given the conditions, how has your familiarity with this golf course helped you?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** A ton. Knowing where to miss it on the greens, using the wind to your advantage coming in so that you're either chipping or putting back into the wind. Hardest part with this northeast wind is all the crosswinds, it's so hard to judge how much the wind's going to take it on the approach shots. You've got to miss it in the right areas and then you've got to know when to be aggressive.

**Q. What are you most proud of this week, 13 birdies or one bogey?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** One bogey. I've been scrambling great when I got out of position. Like I said, missing in the right spots. Feel really comfortable about every aspect of my game. Looking forward to a chance tomorrow.

**Q. You can't choose the conditions, but would you rather it blow tomorrow and why?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** I love when it blows. I feel like I have more of an advantage when it blows, I have more control of my golf ball. Just can't get the lead too far away. I think we're going to have less wind tomorrow, it's going to be a shootout.
