



ROBERT STREB (-17)

Q. You bogeyed two of the first three holes and really you struggled on two of the first three holes, missing two of the first three greens and then you bring it back. I was really impressed you were able to keep it together through those first four, five holes.

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, made some good up-and-downs there on 1 and 3 and just, yeah, was just trying to find something. Good two-putt on 2 as well, and 4. So it wasn't the greatest start, but got out of there with a bunch of pars and tried to find some consistency and it got better.

Q. By my count you had four putts outside of 50 feet and two-putted all of them. That's one of the reasons why you're bogey free. When you won here before, you were able to come from behind. What are your thoughts going into the final round?

ROBERT STREB: Just trying to keep doing what I'm doing. I don't think the wind's supposed to blow quite as hard tomorrow, so probably got to make a few birdies. Guessing a few guys will go low and see how we do.

Q. Close to a lead on Sunday, does sleep become harder, heart rate's a little faster?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, it's probably just hard to get your mind away from it. You're just trying to put it aside for a little while, not think about it too much and just show up and play golf the next day if you can.

Q. Kids are here, too?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, yeah, kids are here and in-laws are here. Catherine, she'll be 6 in February and David's 2 and a half.

Q. So was she born --

ROBERT STREB: She was -- Maggie was pregnant when I won there.

Q. Does she follow your tournaments and root for you yet?

ROBERT STREB: She doesn't care.

Q. Are you talking about Maggie?

ROBERT STREB: Yeah, Maggie's here. Catherine, she doesn't care. "Yeah, you did good," but that's about as far as it goes.

Q. What's the Streb family going to do tonight, tomorrow morning before you tee off?

ROBERT STREB: Probably just get some dinner and chase the kids around a little bit, then put them to bed and then kill a little time in the morning with them.

Q. Do you remember what you did on Saturday night before you won here or was that too long ago?

ROBERT STREB: No, I don't. Probably got ice cream.

Q. Large or small?

ROBERT STREB: Most likely large.

Q. When you won here five years ago, you had on your bucket list playing in a Masters and going to an OU-Texas game. Have you been to an OU-Texas game yet?

ROBERT STREB: Sadly, I have not, no. I think I've been working a few times and I think I had something going on last time where I think I could have made it. Might have been this year actually, but with all this stuff going on, wasn't going to go, it wouldn't have been that much fun.
