Q. Jason, overall what was working well for you today?

JASON DAY: Well, I think I drove it half decently well. I mean, when I did miss it, I missed it in pretty good spots and then out of the rough I hit some nice iron shots to at least give myself a chance at getting up and down. You know, overall I feel pretty happy with my putting. I think I putted a lot better today than I had in the past and I think it's just a good step in the right direction.

Q. Everyone's learning this golf course and some guys had trouble on the back, but you had a flawless back.

JASON DAY: Yeah.

Q. Just talk about the course and how it challenges the field.

JASON DAY: Yeah, definitely the back, I feel like the back side's a little bit tougher. Obviously scoring opportunities, you get two par 5s on the front, a couple shorter holes on the front as well, but if you can try and get yourself at least 1, 2 or 3 under par going through the front side, you can kind of snag maybe one or two and you end up having a pretty decent round.

This is very difficult around the greens with that bermudagrass, and the runoffs, they're very, very inconsistent in regards to bouncing up the slopes. So if you can leave yourself in some decent locations around the greens, you can have a good opportunity at getting up and down pretty easy or you can leave yourself pretty frustrated at the end of the day.

Q. Lastly, what did it feel like to have fans out there for the first time in so long?

JASON DAY: It was actually really nice. It was something that I think a lot of us have been waiting for and hoping for and it was nice to be able to see. I mean, we only had like 2,500 I think in today, but it felt like a lot. Overall, very happy to be out playing in front of fans. Playing with Phil is always a treat, and Viktor as well, but when you're playing with Phil you usually get a few fans and seemed like we had a nice grouping today.
