



Q. Wes, 5 under today, the best round of the day so far. Your thoughts?

WES SHORT, JR.: It was getting pretty windy out there today. I chipped very nicely today and putted good. It was tough conditions I thought for the way the wind was blowing and stuff and I just didn't hit it in play enough off the tee to really attack. It was just like defense mode all day, but putted really nice and chipped really nice.

Q. They talked on TV that the wind was affecting some putts. Was that the case for you?

WES SHORT, JR.: Yeah, it would actually break a little bit more or a little bit less. The wind was blowing pretty good there, especially about 14, 15, 16th hole or something like that, started getting a new gear.

Q. What holes were playing more challenging today for you?

WES SHORT, JR.: You know, once that wind kicked up there, you needed to drive it good. I hit it okay most of the day. I think if I remember I only had maybe one bogey, so that was No. 4 or 5, I don't remember. They have some good holes with the new tee boxes and stuff they have here.

Q. At the peak of the wind, what was it, like a one-club, two-club?

WES SHORT, JR.: Probably two. I think it was blowing probably close to 30 I would think.

Q. You always seem to play well here, I think you've got 10 rounds under 70. What is it about this course that suits you?

WES SHORT, JR.: You know, I think the greens are always usually really nice here. I'm used to these type of greens and seemed like generally the pressure's off once you made it to here, so just kind of go out and have a good last tournament of the year. I approached it the same way this year as I did when it was the top 36.

Q. Any big offseason plans?

WES SHORT, JR.: No, just spend some time with the granddaughter I have. She just turned 4 about a month ago, so try to get her to start playing some golf and maybe she can be on the LPGA.
