

**ROUND 4 INTERVIEW**  
**November 8, 2020**



**MACKENZIE HUGHES (-7)**

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**Q. I'm not sure if you know, but that was the lowest final-round score of your PGA TOUR career to date. What was working so well for you out there today?**

**MACKENZIE HUGHES:** Yeah, it was really a bunch of everything. I hit the ball really nicely. Kind of got off to a medium start, I made a nice par on 1 and then hit one close on 2 and kind of got me going. Then yeah, I was hitting my irons close and felt good over the putter. I made one kind of 20-footer. Besides that, everything I made was kind of inside 10 feet, which my M.O. isn't usually to stuff my irons and ball-strike my way around, but it really felt like a relatively stress-free 63, which you can almost never say. It's pretty rare to say that. Yeah, left a few putts out there that would have been really nice to make. Just really thrilled with the round.

**Q. Through the first three rounds, did you see anybody shooting a score that low, because that was the lowest score by two shots so far that's been recorded.**

**MACKENZIE HUGHES:** Yeah, I really didn't see a round like that out there, to be honest. I've been playing the front nine really well this week and I kind of got off to a good start and I thought, well, if I can just figure out this back nine once and for all. I think I was 8 under on the front going into today, so I was getting off to good starts and then just needed to finish it off and luckily I was able to do that.

**Q. Next week you're going to be watching a couple Canadians in the Masters. Any preview for them next week?**

**MACKENZIE HUGHES:** I like all their chances. My buddy Corey Connors is playing great, Mike's been playing great on the Champions Tour, so it will be really exciting. Nick's first time, Adam seems to always play pretty well there. I look for one of them to make some noise or hopefully more.
