

BILLY ANDRADE (-7)

Q. Billy, yesterday you told us this golf course comes down to five shots. How well did you play those today?

BILLY ANDRADE: Pretty good. I think it could be six shots. I just know there's a few shots out there you have to hit a very good shot into, No. 4, No. 9, you've got 18 here, come in, if you're going for this, you have to hit a good shot. You can't hit a squirrely shot and get away with it. Today was a solid day just like yesterday. Had a lot of chances, which was great. It's always great to play with Jim Furyk and John Huston, an easy, easy pairing for me. It's nice to have an eagle try on the last hole and see what the leaderboard looks like. It's not playing easy. I think it's probably the toughest it's played in all the years that we've played here, so by looking at the leaderboard, you can tell that, so I'm looking forward to tomorrow.

Q. Can you talk walk us through the eagle on 18?

BILLY ANDRADE: I hit a really good drive there. I teed up my ball low there so I could maybe catch a runner, so I did and it ran down there.

And it's interesting because I took out my utility club and I put in a 5-wood because yesterday it was a perfect 5-wood to go for it and my utility couldn't go there. So we were trying to play smart, so I switched clubs and I hit a really good drive where I was lucky that I could hit 4-iron, had a perfect yardage, perfect distance for a 4-iron and just hit a beautiful shot.

Q. That was a bank shot worthy of Tim Duncan.

BILLY ANDRADE: It was. I think Tim would have been proud.

Q. That's how you played that?

BILLY ANDRADE: Well, I know anyway, actually Furyk said something on the green. He goes, I laid up in a divot and so he had a hard third shot and he saw my ball kick off that mound and that's the way I played it and he ended up making a birdie by seeing what my ball did.

Yeah, I think if I hit my shot at the hole or on the green, it's probably going to go over the green. So lucky it hit soft in that Zoysia over to the right. I was just thrilled that it didn't go long because that back bunker's not easy, especially with that hole location.

Q. And hole-out on 11?

BILLY ANDRADE: I was first to hit.

Q. That's one of the five shots you have to hit?

BILLY ANDRADE: Yes, and I was first to hit and the wind kind of felt like it was helping out of the right a little and hit a beautiful 6-iron and just flushed it, and the minute I hit, I was like, get down. It carried past the hole and went in the bunker. The other two guys -- it was 193 yards and Furyk and Houston both hit 7s and they both hit it close. So it's interesting. It's very, very difficult to be the first guy and pull out 7 there. And so I hit the 6 in the back bunker. Pretty basic bunker shot there, had a nice lie there and was kind of a chip and let it run to the hole and got lucky and went in.

Q. What's it going to take tomorrow? On a scale, do you think it really is making harder --

BILLY ANDRADE: Well, I think the scores are indicating that usually it's maybe --

Q. Perfect conditions.

BILLY ANDRADE: Maybe a little -- maybe a little better scoring with the bent greens because the greens are softer. I just think these greens are very, very firm. Everyone's talking about it. And they're very fast. Like you watch the front nine. On 1, 2, 3, 4, I had all downhill putts. Those are hard to - obviously hard to make consistently. You just try to wiggle it down there and hopefully you try to make one. But these greens are, everyone's paying attention. Tomorrow, what's it go to take? Good ball-striking, make some birdies and just a good solid day and give myself an opportunity.

Q. I don't know if you'll be in the last group or not, I don't know what that would mean.

BILLY ANDRADE: Great. It doesn't matter. We're all bunched up.

Q. More people?

BILLY ANDRADE: Yeah, a lot of people have a chance, so I'm glad to be one of them.
