

BILLY ANDRADE (-7)

Q. Billy, can you just start by talking about this week as a whole?

BILLY ANDRADE: Oh, it's just a great week. To be at home, to play a course that is as challenging as this and in such amazing shape. It's a hell of a week for all of us. I think hats off to the superintendent here, he's done an unbelievable job. Just to see fans back out at these tournaments, it means a lot to all of us. And you can't not help but say thank you to Mitsubishi Electric for having this event. It means a lot to us on our tour. They do this, they do Hualalai in January in Hawaii, so all in all, it's been a great week.

Q. For you today, was it just not being able to get anything really going?

BILLY ANDRADE: You know, I birdied the first hole, and the first hole I had a level putt and then it just seemed like the rest of the day I was just above the hole like so many holes. I hit good shots, but I have all these little testers and all these downhillers breaking just a little bit here and there. I just couldn't get anything to drop. You know, it was frustrating, but when you're going through a stretch like that, you've just got to keep at it. You never know.

He had one before coming down the stretch. If I could have made the putt on 15 and 16 and put some pressure on him, but nobody put any pressure on him, so it was kind of a walk in the park for him. And then 18 I had a perfect club to that hole location with my utility and I hit a really good shot. I just -- it just turned just a little too much. If it was a little better online, it would have been right there, make eagle. You don't know. If I can stick it in there, I don't know, he may be in a divot, he could chunk it in the water, make a 6, I make a 3, now we're in a playoff. So I was still thinking coming down the stretch that if I could get one or get two or even the last hole, I felt like I had to go for it and try to have a chance anyway.

Q. You had to be aggressive?

BILLY ANDRADE: Yeah, I had to.

Q. And lastly, you had a good view of how Dicky was playing. What do you think of his --

BILLY ANDRADE: Yeah, he was a little -- at the beginning he had a few off shots, but then he birdied the eighth hole from off the green and then he clicked in and he really didn't miss much after that. So he drove it well, he kept it in play, he hit almost all the greens as I can remember. He didn't have a whole lot of issues except on 15 and 16, and he bogeyed 15 and 16, made a hell of an up-and-down.

But hats off, he shot 67 on a hard golf course on a hard day. And I knew that was the number and I knew if I shot that number I would have a chance to win, and sure enough, he did it.
