



MIGUEL ANGEL JIMENEZ (-10)

Q. Miguel, leading going into Sunday. Your thoughts on today's round?

MIGUEL ANGEL JIMENEZ: Well, today's round was I make a 3 under par. Not as good a score as yesterday. Still hitting good, hitting some good shots there, a couple up-and-downs. A little bit unlucky a couple of times, the ball was in a divot and a little bounce when I made the bogey. There was a hump you could not see there, put the ball on the (indiscernible.) But the game is solid, 3 under par I think is a fair result, maybe a couple more birdies, but that's golf.

Q. Miguel, what was your mindset after the bogey, and then to come back with back-to-back birdies, how did you flip the switch?

MIGUEL ANGEL JIMENEZ: Well, it was the only bogey of the day. Also got it on the previous hole where I hit a nice shot with a 3-wood and my ball was in a big divot and my (indiscernible) was in my hand that you're supposed to make for birdie, but the ball in the bunker, had to work to make a par.

That hole, for example, the second shot I had 124 meters to the hole and I wanted to put it just on the front because it's downwind and firm on the front. Just six paces on the green, I needed to be on the front edge. The ball is in line with the flag, but it's a little bit -- it bounced straight to the left. It happens, no? But I know I've been hitting good. The only thing you need to do is keep the focus.

And then the next hole, hit a beautiful driver, another position I want, make a beautiful shot, put the ball just five feet for birdie.

The next one I hit a massive drive there, very solid, and 7-iron second shot just past the flag on the rough just by 7, 8 meters to the hole. Nice approach there and had a birdie there. It was nice. Everything good. Pity on the last hole. I hit a great putt on the last hole, but it need a couple more rounds of speed. That's golf.

Q. And then you've had numerous opportunities out here, you've been in different positions going into final rounds, but to go into the final round with a lead, what is the mindset there? How is it different than chasing, and what are your expectations?

MIGUEL ANGEL JIMENEZ: You're going to be 18 holes anyway, you know? The thing you have to do tomorrow is keep patience, have a good swing rhythm and let everything happen. You have to respect all the players that are behind you, they're all great players, and tomorrow the one who plays better will win the tournament. Or the one who keep more

concentrating, more calm, you know. Don't think about it, just do your best.

Q. The way this course is firming up though, will anything be different about the process?

MIGUEL ANGEL JIMENEZ: No, it's going to be the same for everyone, you know. The golf course is playing firm, fast and the greens are very fast but they are very fair. Tomorrow probably the more important club is going to be the club No. 15, this one (pointing to head.)
