Q. Just fill everybody in on sort of the emotions of what's an incredible day for you.

DAVID SKINNS: Yeah, it hit me pretty hard inside when I saw that Stephan hadn't holed out the second shot. I've got to give my caddie, Hogan, yeah, it's been a lot of years coming. That's all I can say and I'm so happy it's finally here.

Q. And the tee shot on 18, you kind of joked about it up there, but were you concerned when that thing's flying that far left?

DAVID SKINNS: Concern's maybe the wrong word. I knew it wasn't going to be great, but I was okay with wherever it ended up. Even if I had to chip out, I figured I could get it up and down from the fairway if I needed to. I wasn't too concerned, just I didn't drove it particularly well on the back nine except for the one drive I really needed, which was 11 and I had a really good one and could kind of make it work from there to just do enough, I guess.

Q. Take us through the rollercoaster starting on 12.

DAVID SKINNS: Yeah, I was in a divot on 12 and I figured -- you saw it on TV. It wasn't a bad one, it was just in the wrong part of it. It was all the way towards the back. I didn't think I hit too bad of a shot, just came up short. Then I had a terrible lie in the bunker, couldn't do anything with it. Really proud of the way I bounced back on 13. That was a tricky putt, but I hit a perfect one.

Good two-putt on 14 and then really unfortunate break on 15, but I did a great job not letting it get to me and just did the best I could from there and finished pretty well with a couple nice up-and-downs.

Q. How far is this from DoorDash last year?

DAVID SKINNS: Yeah, that's a long way. It's a long way from DoorDash, driving around delivering food.

Q. Could you imagine this day would come as you're --

DAVID SKINNS: Yeah, yeah. I never didn't think it would happen. It's taken a lot of years, it's taken a lot of effort and this is just -- I knew I had to win and I knew I could win. The fact that it's happened is just, it's a little surreal right now. But yeah, I'm just really proud of the way I stayed with it one shot by one shot, didn't get ahead of myself.
