DAVID TOMS (-10, won first playoff hole)

Q. David, coming down the stretch at 17 and 18 you had to hit two remarkable putts to get down in two. You get your second win on the PGA TOUR Champions here. I know it's been a long wait. What does this do for you?

DAVID TOMS: Just, you know, I still work hard. It's tough. I mean, guys prepare every week, they play great. Means a lot obviously, it means a lot. But, you know, I felt good all week here. It felt like a PGA TOUR event with the crowds and everything, the build-out.

I was worried early in the week, the golf course was really soft, Zoysia fairways, it was playing crazy long, and I was like, man, if we just don't get any more rain it might be okay. Just got faster, faster, faster, I started driving the ball really well, setting myself up. Speed was better today with the putter. I didn't make everything, but I felt good over it, which is key for me. Hopefully I can build on that and move forward.

Can't wait to get to South Dakota, go if pheasant hunting for a few days, really excited about that and see if we can do it again. I feel good about my game so you never know. That's why you keep plugging, you keep plugging, you keep working and it happened.

Q. I've got to tell you, I see the emotion right now and I know how much work you put into this. Is it worth the payoff right now, worth all the hard work?

DAVID TOMS: Yeah. It's always -- you know, when you win, it's worth it. You look back, the hardest part's being away from home. It's good, yeah, it's definitely worth it.
