

**ROUND 2 INTERVIEW
NOVEMBER 12, 2021**



SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER (-6)

Q. Yesterday maybe not the start you were looking for, but today, big bounce back, course record. What was clicking?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I started hitting some fairways. Yesterday I was playing out of the rough most of the time, so it was just nice getting the ball out there in play, give myself some opportunities. This golf course can be pretty challenging from the bermuda rough and you've got to hit the ball in play. If you're hitting it in the rough to elevated greens that you can't hold just because you're hitting knucklers out of the rough, so it was very important to get the ball in the fairway.

Q. Do you have any course records?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Yeah, somebody else just asked me that. I have a few. I have my home course, I have another course in Dallas and I have the course at Northern Trust, I can't remember the name.

Q. Liberty National?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Last year. I don't know.

Q. We'll look it up.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Yeah, whatever it was. I assume no one beat 59 there I hope, but you never know.

Q. TPC Boston?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: TPC Boston, whatever that one is. If someone beat it, that stinks, but I feel like I have that one as well.

Q. You talk about getting mad and the impact it had on your game. Did it just wake you up, or what difference did it make?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I mean, I think anger can go a few ways on the golf course. You can use it and get even more frustrated and more pissed off and you start thinking negatively. I used that anger today as a positive. After I bogeyed No. 4 I basically told myself I've had enough of this crap. That's what I told my caddie, too, walking down 5 fairway. Hit a nice putt on 6 and just kind of turned the round around from there.

Q. What hole did you restart on this morning?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Four green, I think.

Q. And then did the -- you had very little time between rounds. Did you get anything? Were you able to (inaudible) in that little bit of time?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I thought I did, I went out, I had breakfast, I went on the range and tried to hit a few shots and I hit it good on the range and I got to No. 1 and just hit a duck hook off the tee. Then after that I felt like I struck the ball really well today. I'm going to hit a few balls this afternoon and get some lunch, but outside of that, I feel good how I played today.

Q. You're a Texas guy playing here in Houston and you've got fans all over the place and you're one of top young golfers on the Tour. Do you pick up on the fans pulling for you out here?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Yeah, I definitely like it when they're cheering for you. We had a few people watching our group today, which is always fun. It was nice to have the support out there.

Q. Any thoughts on the facility, just the course and some of the new structures and things they have around here?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Yeah, I think the course here is really solid. It's a challenging golf course. I really appreciate that. I feel I get a little tired of playing the golf courses where you've got to shoot 20-something under to win. Out here maybe winning in the mid teens, high teens, whatever it is, that's a nice challenging course.

Q. How old were you when you set the course record at Royal Oaks and whose record did you beat?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Royal Oaks took me a bit longer to get. I think I had to wait till college to get that one. I think Colton had it for a while or maybe Fin Ewing. I can't quite remember, but it took me a little while to beat it.

Q. Any experience out here in junior golf or anything?
