

**ROUND 2 INTERVIEW
NOVEMBER 12, 2021**

**KEVIN SUTHERLAND
KRISTOFFER MARSHALL**



Q. We were timing you, wanted to see if you beat Kenny yesterday. You did.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: Did I?

Q. You did, by eight minutes or so. Under three hours.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: Really? I had to get it rolling on 17, too. Slow it down.

Q. Still a good time.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: Thank you.

Q. Is that one of the fastest rounds you probably played?

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: Yeah, and Kris plays really fast, so it just worked out great for both of us. Just kind of playing my -- I didn't really feel like I was rushing, just kind of playing, but that was definitely the fastest turnaround I think I've ever had.

Q. Was that kind of your best groove? Do you like to play fast?

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: I like to be able to get up and hit it. When it's my turn to hit, I like to be able to get it. So today was that way, just get up, and because Kris was easy, he just kind of stayed out of the way a little bit.

Q. How's your leg feeling? I know you WD'd last event at TimberTech.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: It's okay. It started bothering me a little towards the end.

Q. It's your knee?

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: It's my knee. I never had a knee problem before until Saturday. Using the (inaudible) thing so just ice and rest and anti-inflammatories. Unfortunately, the resting isn't really happening so much, but that's where I'm at. So the knee, it's okay. It's not -- it was a lot worse over the weekend, so it's getting better.

Q. Talk about Kristoffer's game. What did you see from him today?

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: Oh, he's got a great game, hits a long ways, very impressed. State

am, right? Yeah, you can see it. It's tough for -- he's trying not to be in the way and he's trying to play, but he doesn't want to play. It's like we were talking about how it's just tough -- it's tough when you're not like playing for -- we're talking about you.

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: It's weird, I've played in tons of tournaments and that's very, very weird. Tee to green I feel like I'm playing with you and out there I'm just trying to get out of the way.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: You were great, it was easy. I understand, I can imagine being in that situation, I'll just get out of the way.

Q. There's something unwritten like you let him tee off first, you let him hit first?

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: We kind of did honor, didn't we?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: We did. I did that with Kenny yesterday, we played honors yesterday.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: Did you hole out every putt?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: Yeah, like today like I was -- I was joking around with the crowd out there, I was like, should I sweep -- it was like a two-footer for par. I'm like, just sweep this, just mess with them because I don't think a lot of people realize -- I've got a gray beard, I don't know, who is this guy?

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: You had like a two-footer and he just picks it up.

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: I shot about even both days. It's just weird not like going through the -- I've never -- I feel like I'm playing in a tournament, but I'm not going through my normal routine of like looking at putts from every side. Anyways, it was fun, but.

Q. Enough of a gallery to make a difference for you?

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: We kind of got there before them I think a little bit.

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: Yeah. Yesterday I was back in the corner somewhere and I made a nice birdie and Mickelson drained a birdie at the same time and I'm like, well, that wasn't for me, that was for him.

Q. So the conditions, is this unlike anything you've ever played?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: No, I've played a lot -- I've played Tour events before. I play a lot of the national amateur stuff. So this is really good, the greens are really good right now. Probably a little, maybe one quicker than the norm for a tournament, but they're so good and the golf course is in such great shape and the golf course (inaudible). I just played the

(inaudible) up here maybe a month and a half ago where the top ams in the state play the top PGA section guys. This is a lot different than it was a month and a half ago.

Q. Are you from Arizona?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: I'm from Kansas originally, but been out here since I graduated KU.

Q. What's your home course out here?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: Silverleaf.

Q. How was the birthday party yesterday? Did you make it in time?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: I did, I was only 15 minutes late, little guy never noticed. My wife was thrilled. She was like, wow, you guys played fast.

Q. Where do you live?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: Up in Grayhawk, North Scottsdale, yeah.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: I guess we beat Kenny by eight minutes today.

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: We did? Well that's -- Kenny's a little bit heavier than you are. He's one of my good buddies and his legs -- oh, yeah, he's got tree trunks for legs, so they probably don't move quite as quick.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: I told him we lost a couple minutes on 17, I asked for a ruling.

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: He swears he's fast.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: I didn't know we were in a race.

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: Both these guys are pretty quick, but KP just grabs the number and goes. Like we played a lot of golf together and good dear friend of mine. I got paired with the two nicest guys so far.

Q. At what point today are you going to start scoreboard watching to see who you're going to be with tomorrow?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: The funny thing about only 36, 35 guys is by the time the birthday party was over, I already knew I was playing with him. They're all done out there. This is not -- this isn't Waste Management where it goes all the way to 7:00 p.m.

Q. Anybody you hope to maybe --

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: The beautiful thing, I've got quite a few friends out here on the Champions Tour. The cool thing about it is these guys are always in a good mood, happy to play golf. It would be kind of fun to play with somebody I didn't maybe know before and somebody who's like a (inaudible). I'm just lucky to be out here.

Q. What do you do? What's like your normal --

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: I run business development for (inaudible) of Merrill Lynch, so we've got an office here and Bellevue, Washington. It allows me to play a lot of golf because we do all our business down on the golf course.

Q. How did you get into the game?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: I played at KU.

Q. Like as a kid, how did you start?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: The real answer is played hockey and everybody started getting bigger than me and I got banged up real good. My grandpa's like, maybe you should try something else. So I started playing at 16 and then walked on at KU and then (inaudible).

Q. Were you before (inaudible) I guess maybe?

KRISTOFFER MARSHALL: Yeah, Woody came in right as I was going on.
