

**ROUND 2 INTERVIEW
NOVEMBER 12, 2021**



KEVIN TWAY (-9)

Q. Long day for you, heard you mention you got nine holes in this morning and a full 18. How are you feeling today coming into the clubhouse? Have to be pretty pleased after 36 holes?

KEVIN TWAY: Yeah, you're never going to complain about a 64 with a couple hole-outs. I played very well, putted well. I'm a little tired now, but All in all a good day.

Q. With this course, what kind of threats does it pose where it really clicks to be having your game go well on the green?

KEVIN TWAY: Yeah, the greens are big, so if you hit them, you've got some crazy putts, but as long as you can get semi close to the hole, they're good surfaces, you can make some putts.

Q. In general, what do you think about the golf course out here, the tournament?

KEVIN TWAY: I like it. It's a good course. It pays to be long and straight out here and if you're in the fairway you can get at some holes. The greens are very good, so I enjoy it.

Q. You enjoy bermudagrass?

KEVIN TWAY: I do. I live in Florida, so been playing on bermuda for about five or six years at home, so I'm used to it. I putted well today, it's nice.

Q. Did you qualify for the U.S. Open out here in Houston? There would be a U.S. Open qualifier, did you have a qualifier out here?

KEVIN TWAY: Maybe --

Q. Not at this course, but --

KEVIN TWAY: Maybe in like 2016.

Q. At Lakeside?

KEVIN TWAY: Yeah, Lakeside.

Q. I was out there, I covered that, saw you out there.

KEVIN TWAY: Okay. A while ago.

Q. I could tell it was kind of a far distance. What I was getting at, when you've had success at any kind of tournament in a certain city on any -- could be junior golf or anything, does that ever kind of come up when you're thinking about playing that tournament that next week? Like, hey, I'm going back to a certain city?

KEVIN TWAY: I think this just more plays like Oklahoma golf where I'm from in Oklahoma. It's more same kind of fairways, same kind of wind, so I'm comfortable in these conditions.

Q. But you didn't think about actually, hey, last --

KEVIN TWAY: No, no.

Q. You always hear at Lakeside, it was good for my career.

KEVIN TWAY: I forgot about that. That was a while ago.

Q. Five years is a long time in golf, isn't it? I guess you've got to like where you're at right now with two days to go?

KEVIN TWAY: Absolutely. Just try to keep hitting fairways and greens like we all try to do and just have fun.
