

ROUND 3 INTERVIEW
July 23, 2022



GREYSON SIGG (-11)

Q. Nice playing today, you must be happy to be done after an awfully long day. What did you do really well out there?

GREYSON SIGG: Yeah, it was a long day, that's for sure. Kind of got off to a slow start there, bogeyed I think No. 4, but made some nice putts coming in on the front nine there and kind of got hot there. They called us off the course, but came back out and continued to make some putts, so it was a good day.

Q. How difficult is it to do that when you have a day that long to keep that momentum going?

GREYSON SIGG: Yeah, it's hard. You just can't think much about it, just try and come in and relax as much as possible and just come back out and keep doing what you were doing.

Q. Of all the players out here, you're probably the one that didn't want the delay the most. A little bit more on that run you were on and then you hear the horns, what's going through your mind?

GREYSON SIGG: Yeah, I've been playing good all week. It was just one of those things where I could come in and try and relax and then try and -- I think it was a five-hour delay, so get some food and take -- I took like a 30-minute nap so that was nice, but came back out and continued to kind of stay hot there.

Q. Was this morning about as gettable as the course has been all week?

GREYSON SIGG: Really all day. Once we came back out I want to say for probably 30 minutes or so it started blowing a little bit, but other than that, we played probably 16 holes that was absolutely perfect for golf.

Q. From the course standpoint this morning, what was it that was kind of the best about it?

GREYSON SIGG: Just wasn't much wind. In the last couple days we've had a little bit of wind and the greens were soft so it was very gettable. I gave myself a lot of chances today, so that was huge for me.

Q. Scott's not done yet but tomorrow, what's your mindset going into the final round?

GREYSON SIGG: Yeah, just shoot as low as possible, just give myself as many looks as possible and hopefully see a few go it.

Q. How fun is it for you to be in this position? First year on tour, you're looking up on the board there and you're right there?

GREYSON SIGG: Yeah, it's definitely great. It's been kind of a slow start to this year I would say, but I'm finally right where I want to be.

Q. What would you assess is like the key to your week?

GREYSON SIGG: You know, Kev, I would just say I've been playing good the last three or four weeks. This week I was able to get the putter hot this afternoon. I've been hitting it really well and just continued to give myself chances and stay patient. Working on my attitude a little bit and I feel like that improved a lot this week as well. So Just go out tomorrow and keep doing what I'm doing.

Q. What about your attitude have you like improved?

GREYSON SIGG: Just trying to not get down on yourself. It's a frustrating game, it's a hard game. It can be especially at times, but the last -- I'd say the middle of the stretch here in the season it was tough, but starting to play really good again so looking forward to the rest of the year.

Q. What would it mean to you to make the FedExCup Playoffs?

GREYSON SIGG: It would mean a lot. That's -- I don't really expect anything else. So I expect a lot of myself and looking forward to kind of doing that in the next couple weeks.
