
Q. Four under for third round on cruise control, what did you like about today?

RICKIE FOWLER: I did a lot of things good. I mean, kept it fairly simple on myself, executed pretty well out there today. Didn't putt as well as I had the last two days. Good solid day. Like I said, it was fairly stress free. I did hit a lot of good putts, but greens were getting pretty beat up late in the day and with the soft conditions, but all you can do is hit good putts and see what happens from there. Hopefully, tomorrow we'll get a few more to go.

Q. What's the mindset heading into tomorrow? How much do you draw upon past experiences?

RICKIE FOWLER: I mean, a little bit. It's been a while since I've been in this situation. Last year at CJ was in a similar situation, but other than that, there hasn't been much the last few years.

Obviously remember being in those situations before, but no, it will be tough tomorrow, but also fun. I'm looking forward to the challenge. I'm going to have to play well and continue to do what I've been doing the last three days. Keegan, Putty on down the list, there's plenty of guys within a few shots. I'm out front, in control, but that can change if I don't execute like I have been.

Q. Help to keep it familiar playing with Keegan again for the final pairing tomorrow, and I believe Viktor?

RICKIE FOWLER: I knew Keegan, but I wasn't sure who the third would be. Yeah, Keegan and I play a bit at home at Grove, practice a decent amount together. He's always fun to play with. And if we have Viktor, that will be a great addition to make our third. We'll definitely enjoy it. They're good guys to play with, but I've just got to go out there and, like I said, execute and keep moving forward.

Q. Anything looking to fine tune before tomorrow's final round?

RICKIE FOWLER: I've done a very good job of managing what I've had out there. Continue to do what I've been doing. I would like to drive it a little bit better to set up more situations where I can be a little bit more aggressive and step on the gas into the greens. Other than that, definitely happy with how things have gone so far.

Q. Rickie, you had a few struggles last year. Did you always believe that you could

get back and get yourself into situations like this?

RICKIE FOWLER: Yeah, definitely had some tough times the last few years, but I always knew it was there. It was always just a fine line, a shot or two here or there. Just nice to kind of see starting to build momentum and confidence and get the ball rolling the right direction.

Q. I know there's still another round to play and I don't want to get ahead of anything, but what would it mean to you if you were to win tomorrow?

RICKIE FOWLER: It would be amazing. Obviously, showing up here, we came over here to win. Last few months have been really good, starting to see a lot of positives. I believe I can do it, but like I said earlier, I know it's going to be tough.

It's going to be a challenge, but I just have to keep doing what I've been doing the last few days.

Q. What was your thinking with the second shot out of the fairway bunker on 18?

RICKIE FOWLER: I mean, there, I didn't have a very good lie. I was kind of sitting in a little like low spot, so there was no thought of trying to go for it or hit it any further than where I did. Was just trying to get one back in play, give myself a wedge to that pin and I hit it in a very good spot out of the fairway to have a good angle.
