



**Q. I want to know what's more impressive, what Alker's on the verge of doing or Bernhard Langer potentially tying the mark?**

**JERRY KELLY:** I mean, both completely different, but extremely consistent. It's a testament to their willpower. The grit that Alker has showed, you know, in his top-10s last year and getting here last year and then just continuing that success with wins all through this year, just incredible consistency.

And that is Bernhard Langer to a T. He's just always going to be there. He's battled some injuries the last couple years, you know, and he still won the cupolas year. Yeah, it's beyond words for me.

**Q. The six-shot win last week, that was pretty impressive coming in. What would it mean for the Tour for him to like finally catch Hale Irwin?**

**JERRY KELLY:** Well, let's just wait until next year so I can win this one, OK? It would be fantastic. Maybe Morocco when I'm not there, that would be awesome.

**Q. So you're third, a little bit too far back, but you had a pretty good season. What could have gone a little bit different for you maybe and you would be in this chase, too?**

**JERRY KELLY:** It's that consistency. My bad weeks were not very good. His bad weeks were the tail end of a top-10.

Health-wise, you know, once he puts a little more mileage on his body, we'll see how that goes. But it's trying to be up there consistently, but it's trying to keep the body in shape to be able to do that. It's been hard. You battle injuries pretty consistently out here at this age and you lose strength really quick. Wasn't very good at getting it back. And once I get into the swing of things and I play great, then something else happens and you just start the cycle again. But I'm not going to stop the cycle, I'm going to keep going, so that's all it is.
