ROUND 2 INTERVIEW

ANDREW YUN (-7)

**Q. Coming out of the morning wave, walk us through today's round. How did it go?**

**ANDREW YUN:** Played really well on the front nine. Made a birdie, had a three-hole stretch went birdie, eagle, birdie, then I birdied 18 to shoot 5 under on the front nine. The front nine was really good. And the wind started picking up there on the front nine, which was my back. Made a couple bad swings with the wind, but it's going to happen out here. Other than that, I finished strong with two birdies coming in, so it was good.

**Q. You mentioned 18 on the walk over here and the difficulty it presents. Walk us through that hole. Today obviously a big birdie there.**

**ANDREW YUN:** Yeah, it was straight into the wind. It's not a long par 5, but then that tee shot is always dicey because you've got trouble left and right. Hit a good tee ball there and then another second shot with trouble left and right there, too. Just got to keep it in play. Once you do, then it's a birdie opportunity, but the first two shots are definitely key out there.

**Q. You mentioned the wind. You're a west coast guy, but what's it like, island golf? The wind starts picking up, how's it kind of change your mentality mid round?**

**ANDREW YUN:** You know, you have to hit the ball solid. My ball flight is naturally a little bit lower so I think it just, it presents better for the wind. Because of that I've been able to have some success when it's windy. I think in Exuma back in 2017 I played really well and finished second out there. I don't mind it, but like I said, you've just got to hit the ball really solid.

**Q. With the week being a little different, you're going into Tuesday but it's weekend golf now, how's it kind of been from the setup for you?**

**ANDREW YUN:** It's not bad. You get lost in what day it is because obviously you're used to playing on the weekend but it's not necessarily a weekend. It's still half the tournament to go, still 36 more holes, so you just take it day by day, shot by shot.

**Q. Do you ever catch yourself walking, looking out at the water and kind of lose track of what's going on?**

**ANDREW YUN:** Oh, yeah, we're definitely blessed to be able to play this game for a living

and then to be able to do it here in Bahamas to start the season off here, it doesn't really get much better. It's a little dent in the wallet, but other than that it's great.

**Q. Does the location kind of play into the relaxation on the course?**

**ANDREW YUN:** Yeah, probably. My wife, she's not too happy when she's FaceTiming me when I'm on the beach chilling and she's at home taking care of the kids. It's two definitely different areas. But yeah, definitely, it's hard not to be relaxed out here.

**Q. Hopefully you can bring a trophy home for her.**

**ANDREW YUN:** That would be great.

**Q. You're proving to yourself early on in this season that you can go low. What do you credit that to? Was there any offseason prep that you went through that you needed to do for this season?**

**ANDREW YUN:** No, I just took care of the kids, didn't really play too much golf. Having kids has definitely put life in perspective and golf in perspective. Bad shots aren't necessarily that bad anymore. I think just more mentally it's been a little bit different.
