Q. All right, John, we have beautiful weather, seems like a good day of golf. What was working out there for you?

JOHN HUSTON: I played pretty good. I started off hitting the ball really well and I made a few -- when it got windy there at the end, I made a few good saves so kind of held the score together.

Q. The coverage is taped so I didn't get to see anything that happened, but what was working out there for you today?

JOHN HUSTON: A little bit of everything. I mean, I putted pretty good. Greens are tough. But I drove it good and I had three or four kind of tap-ins, one for eagle on 17 there, kind of kept the score together.

Q. I see you haven't won since 2011.

JOHN HUSTON: Yeah.

Q. Is it hard not to look ahead and think, oh, this might be the week?

JOHN HUSTON: I'm too smart for that, I know it's a long ways to go.

Q. Is this the kind of golf course that (inaudible) can keep it going?

JOHN HUSTON: Yeah, there's definitely some opportunities. You've got some short irons into the green, but you've got the little fingers, it's hard to get it close sometimes when the greens get firmer.

Q. What does it mean to you, just everyone saying just this week it's more than a golf tournament? You guys are playing for so much more this week raising awareness. It's Colon Cancer Awareness month. Just to be out here with these survivors, with these patients, what does this tournament mean to you?

JOHN HUSTON: Yeah, it's definitely special. Of course it seems like every week there's something like that that's special. We're fortunate enough to have an effect on it, so I'm happy to be here.
