

ROUND 2 INTERVIEW

Q. You're in great position; just a few comments on how you felt today, like what was going on.

PAUL GOYDOS: First, we've got to give the staff here at Warwick Hills a tremendous round of applause to get the golf course as playable as it was. It was a pretty serious storm. I hear there were five fatalities Wednesday night or Thursday night. At least that's what it said in the news.

I think what they did to get the golf course ready for us to play 36 holes is nothing short of miraculous, so let's get that out of the way.

I played nicely. I drove it in play, which you have to kind of do here. I hit a lot of greens. My lag putting speed was pretty good, and I was fortunate enough to make some of the long ones. Some of the lags went in, and just kind of one of those days that kind of kept going, which was nice.

I played pretty well the first round. In a sense, it was almost better for me to play two in one day because it's almost like one round in a sense, and I was playing well today, and the fact that I got two rounds on a day I was playing well is kind of a bonus.

Q. Was there anything particularly impressive about your game, a part you felt really good about?

PAUL GOYDOS: Yeah, especially early in the second round I putted really well. I made a 25-footer on 8 and a 40-footer on 9, and they were just perfect speed, and I made a nice par putt on 10. I really putted the ball well.

You have to drive it good here. When you're playing the ball ball in hand, driving it in the fairway, you get to pick your lie, and I did drive the ball real well, too. I would say I got a little tired coming in, but I think that's understandable at our age, playing 36 holes.
