Q. Nice way to finish there on the last. Talk us through that shot there on the ninth.

ANDREW NOVAK: Yeah, I left it in a spot I knew I could get up and down from. With ball in hand, it makes that shot a lot easier, get yourself a nice lie. Grain was back into me, same with the slope. So just kind of threw a 60 underneath it, put a little spin on it. It bounced perfectly and rolled right in.

## Q. How would you kind of characterize the rest of your round?

ANDREW NOVAK: A lot more normal and in control, I would say. I hit quite a few fairways, a lot of greens. Just kind of kept the ball in the spots where you need to be and made some putts.
Q. Coming into this week what was kind of your mentality with your position in the FedExCup knowing it's the last event to get in the Playoffs?

ANDREW NOVAK: Yeah, I know I need a good week if I want to get in the Playoffs, but I'm not really doing anything different. I know this is a good tournament for me. It's a course that is very similar to a lot of courses I played growing up. I think if I play well, I absolutely have a chance to compete here. I don't think I necessarily would change anything, but it's just one that I have some confidence playing in.
Q. What parts of your game do you feel like are firing on all cylinders that you like going on right now?

ANDREW NOVAK: I love how I putted today, especially early on. Made some really good par saves, which kept the momentum of the round. Then the ball-striking started clicking on my second nine. Those two phases of the game were really solid. But yeah, the putting, especially with how I putted here last year, was really nice to see.
Q. And you mentioned you're looking forward to the Hall of Fame game tonight. A prediction on the game tonight?

ANDREW NOVAK: We're going to see a lot of backups, it's going to be probably really ugly, I'd take some unders, but I'll be cheering for the Browns for my caddie.
