

## Q. Just give us an assessment of your day with the conditions being so hard. What are your feelings about coming back with a 3 under round?

**YUKI INAMORI:** I knew it was going to be a tough start from the beginning as it was really windy from the start. The important thing was just to be patient throughout the round. There was a long putt on 16 which was about 17 meters that I made and I think that gave me some momentum. There were other holes like where I had some close birdies, for instance maybe four or five meter putts. I think the alignment worked really well and that let me get birdies which led to that overall 3 under score today.

## Q. Have you ever played other tournaments that have this much strong wind?

**YUKI INAMORI:** I've had several experiences in the past where it was pretty windy, but I think this today would probably be the top three this year, so I just felt that I needed to finish with the least strokes as possible.

## Q. How important is this week? Being a PGA TOUR tournament in Japan, how have you been preparing yourself for a major tournament like this?

**YUKI INAMORI:** So I knew this was a four-day tournament, I had to build my physical strength, make sure that I could save as much energy as I can. Because I played this tournament for the first time two years ago, I remember that week very well, so I used that to kind of form my strategy for the week, which I think is helping me so far.

## **Q.** Being in contention going into the last two rounds, what's going to be important for you to focus upon the next two days?

**YUKI INAMORI:** As you said, we do have two days left. Obviously it's already tough conditions, but with the wind factor, obviously it was very different.

Again, as for the next two days, I just want to stick to my game, not be too greedy and try and make all of the opportunities that I have left for the next two days.
