

JUSTIN SUH

Q. Justin, 2 under today for the lead. You must be happy with the effort today?

JUSTIN SUH: Yeah, very satisfied. I think overall throughout the day we just, you know, tried to find fairways, greens. Obviously in the beginning I missed a few greens, but I was on the correct side and I thought making those critical up-and-downs were huge in the beginning.

Q. You had a successful year on the Korn Ferry last season. Coming back to the PGA TOUR, now leading for the first time in the final round. What are some of the experiences you can use from that to maybe help you tomorrow?

JUSTIN SUH: Yeah, I think the experience of the Korn Ferry was huge and I think throughout this year I've put myself in this position a few times in some big tournaments. I think, I don't know, every week you put yourself in this position you learn a little piece of it.

Overall, I think just gaining the experience is the big part and hopefully, you know, I just come here and just do what we've been doing, try to find fairways, greens and just be aware of all the changing conditions.

Q. How big was 15?

JUSTIN SUH: Yeah, 15 was big. That up-and-down was critical, especially going into the last three. And 16 and 17, they're both difficult holes.

But yeah, that up-and-down, I played in that bunker in the practice round. I probably hit four shots just like how I did it, chunked it. It's just a tough bunker shot to get to the green just because of the different gravel here. But to get that up and down was big and just keeping the momentum for tomorrow.

Q. What do you think would be the most important thing for you to try and focus on to try and get this done tomorrow?

JUSTIN SUH: Just a shot at a time, I think that's the most important. Just kind of be aware of myself, aware of the conditions. I think that's kind of all you can do.

Q. And your first time at this tournament, how's it been so far aside from just sitting atop the leaderboard?

JUSTIN SUH: It's been fun. Tuesday we got in at 2:00 a.m., it was a long day. I played 18

holes, went straight to Tokyo afterwards. I went to one of my buddy's dad's restaurant, Shota, so he made us some really good food. Overall, I think it's the best player dining we've had all year, so I'm really excited just to be here.

Q. How long do you think the putt was on 16?

JUSTIN SUH: I'd probably say it was around 35 to 40 feet. Obviously it's not a putt that I was trying to make. It was definitely a left-to-right slider, but just to get it close I was going to be happy with. I think five feet out it was looking really good and just went center cup.
