HARRISON FRAZAR (-6)



Q. A lot of golf left, but obviously 6 under today, you've got to like where you stand after Round 1.

HARRISON FRAZAR: Yeah, yeah, a good start. I hit a few good shots early, capitalized on them. I think I birdied three out of the first five, then just kind of hung in there for a while. Maybe misplayed a few. Made a decent par save and then I hit -- trying to remember -- 14, I think it's 14, hit it in there about four-and-a-half feet and then hit it about eight feet on 15 and hit it about a foot on 16. And then of course 18, what a horrible wedge shot, but I made the putt.

HARRISON FRAZAR: Yeah, a little bit. A lot has transpired since. Yeah, I still feel good, I feel confident. I feel like I belong and I feel comfortable out here. Yeah, just take advantage of it.
