Q. Alex, 3 under puts you at solo second. What did you see out there today? Seems likes scores weren't quite as high as yesterday, or low rather.

ALEX CEJKA: It was a little bit tricky. The pins were a little bit tricky, it was a little bit windier than the last couple days. It seemed like the round went forever, we had a lot of drops, we had a lot of rulings going on so the pace was a little bit slow. I hung in there for a long time, I made stupid -- a couple bogeys, unnecessary but hit a bad swing, so you know, bogeys happen. You want to avoid double bogeys or more.

I'm still pleased with the performance, seeing me up on the leaderboard second, I think. It's pretty good so far.

Q. You had a lot of success here last year. Kind of what do you attribute that to, playing well at this course?

ALEX CEJKA: I'm more a west coast player, you know, living here on the west coast. I like the grass, I like the courses we have here.

I don't know, the last couple years I really like the course, it fits my game pretty good and the greens are in perfect shape. You've just got to give yourself good looks. And 3 under is pretty good. I didn't really play as good as the last couple days, but I scrambled it together.

Q. Would a victory here put the cherry on top of a damn good season?

ALEX CEJKA: Yeah, of course. Yeah, of course. I'm trying to play as good as I can. It would be an incredible finish to a great season, as you said. We'll see. I still think I've got to go a little bit low tomorrow, 5, 6, 7, 8 under I think to have a realistic chance, but you never know in golf.

Q. When will you start pushing, when you get to the back nine, just kind of --

ALEX CEJKA: It all depends how it starts in the morning. The first hole can change things. You make a lucky birdie or lucky eagle or something, it all depends on the first couple holes and then we go from there. But I really don't want to change my game plan from the last couple days, it seems to work for most of the time.
