ADAM SVENSSON (-8)



Q. Adam, nice round. If we can get some comments on your play, please.

ADAM SVENSSON: Yeah, it was a tough day, extremely windy. It was wet, balls were plugging. But yeah, hit the ball well off the tee, hit some nice iron shots and made a couple putts.

Q. Take us through the eagle on 18.

ADAM SVENSSON: Yeah, smoked a driver and hit a 4-iron in there to, I don't know what it was, 30, 40 feet and rolled it in.

Q. You mentioned the conditions. Talk a little bit about the difference in the conditions early as opposed to the back for you.

ADAM SVENSSON: Sorry, earlier?

Q. Yeah, sort of rainy and windy this morning and then it got a lot better toward the end of your rounds.

ADAM SVENSSON: Yeah, it was pouring rain and the sun came out and it got windy and it was a great day.

Q. Talk a little bit about you're all set for next year, you're locked in top-50 so no pressure on you for that. You're here defending, sorted of freewheeling it. Talk a little bit about your mindset.

ADAM SVENSSON: Yeah, I think I still want to play well and I've got really good vibes from this golf course. I seem to like it a lot. I'm excited to play the weekend.

Q. Adam, did you have any ideas or any pre-conceived notions about how difficult it would be to defend and are you drawing on the experience of last year or are you kind of putting that out of your mind and telling yourself it's a new tournament?

ADAM SVENSSON: Yeah, pretty much think it's a new tournament. Usually when you win you have everything going for you, chipping, putting and you're hitting it well. Yeah, just kind of play it like any other tournament and just go out there and, you know.

Q. Do you think you may draw on the experiences from last year if you get in the hunt on Sunday afternoon late and that's when you'll go to the well of what you went

through last year? Is that the point where the experience might help you?

ADAM SVENSSON: Yeah, for sure, especially coming down the stretch on some of those holes, you've got to know where to hit it off the tee. There's some pins where you've got to have some uphill putts. Just kind of remembering what I did from last year.

Q. How long was the birdie on 17?
