Q. You spent a few years on mini tours just before getting to the Korn Ferry Tour and getting to this point. You've kept your exempt card for eight years out here. Is there a sense of kind of -- and still a long career and this can be one blip, but is there a sense of pride of what you've been able to do kind of in your career over this last decade as a whole?

PATTON KIZZIRE: Yeah, I'm proud of what I've done, but at the same time I felt like I haven't done what I'm set out to do. I know you're going to ask what are you set out to do, and don't do that.

No, I'm proud of what I've done, but I'm looking forward to the challenges ahead. Like I say, I feel like my game is probably better right now than it's ever been, I've just got to get some putts to fall.

Q. Are you going to try to play final stage or are you going to go off the status you have?



PATTON KIZZIRE: I'm signed up for it. I'm eager to get back and compete and if they're offering five spots, I'll be there.

Q. Is there anything you're going to try to work on on your game over the next few weeks or are you going to take some time off?

PATTON KIZZIRE: I'll certainly take a few days off and enjoy Thanksgiving with my family and get back at it. It's always a battle. I just got to get some putts to fall. My ball-striking is coming on fast, I'm hitting my driver better than I ever have, hitting really good iron shots at times. Dealing with a lot of emotions over the last several weeks, so that's been something that hasn't necessarily helped me, but I've tried to channel it and focus. I'm looking forward to whatever's next.

Q. Last question, what does it mean to you just in general to be a PGA TOUR member, a PGA TOUR player?

PATTON KIZZIRE: This is what I've always wanted to do since I was a kid. They asked me what I wanted to do when I was in second grade and I said I want to be a professional golfer and I've never changed my mind, so here I am.
