MODERATOR: Welcome to the press conference with Raul Pereda.

Raul, welcome back to the Mexico Open at Vidanta. How do you feel for this edition of the tournament?

MODERATOR: How important for Mexico to have these kind of tournaments?

RAUL PEREDA: It is huge. It is huge for the growth of the game, it is huge to keep showing the generations that we have coming in the near future to pursue the game of golf. Definitely having the Mexico Open, having a PGA TOUR event or two PGA TOUR events in Mexico, it means a lot for the sport in general, for the country, being able to put more kids out there and showing them being able to be in the big league, it's possible.

MODERATOR: Tell us a little more about your goal this year.

RAUL PEREDA: I would like to keep my card, it's definitely something I'm playing hard for. I feel like I'm new out here for so many events. The first event I got a couple souvenirs and tried to put it in my apartment. But definitely I'm not a spectator anymore, I'm one of them. I would love to get Rookie of the Year, I think that would mean a lot. Rookie of the Year my first year out here, of course, and definitely the first of many.

MODERATOR: What's going to be the key to have a great week here at Vidanta?

RAUL PEREDA: Be patient, be patient. I think the course is playing different than last year a little bit, I think the wind direction has changed due to the time of the year that we're



playing. It's softer, but definitely the course is in great conditions, and I'm not hitting it as far as last year.
